“Assisted Living Center Rule Changes – What Change?”

The speakers will review recent changes that have occurred that include a new separate article for assisted living centers, newly defined level of care, drug destruction, and more. These changes also include a significant number of items that physicians, physician assistants, and nurse practitioners must be aware of to serve residents in assisted living centers.

During this presentation, the attendees will receive an update on the many changes that have occurred during the development of the new Administrative Rules of South Dakota 44:70 Assisted Living Centers that include:

- ◆ Reviewing the new restrictions on acceptance and retaining of residents and what assistance can be provided a resident; and
- ◆ Reviewing and discussing several new forms that will be used by the facility and physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner;
- ◆ Discussing the new optional service that permits retaining a resident who has elected hospice under certain conditions; and
- ◆ The rules that permit a physician assistant and nurse practitioners to admit residents to ALCs.
